

2021 undergraduate returning student application for admission



This application can only be used by former Western Washington University undergraduate students returning to pursue a first bachelor's degree, former Western post-baccalaureate students returning to pursue further post-baccalaureate study, and students returning to an Outreach and Community Education (OCE) location program to pursue a bachelor's degree or post-baccalaureate study.

Readmission to the University does not imply you are qualified for your intended major. You should contact the academic department of your intended major as soon as possible to discuss major declaration procedures; this is especially important for programs with separate application processes and students returning to an OCE location program.

Students intending to take only a few courses are encouraged to register through Western's Non-matriculated Student Registration Program rather than to seek formal admission. Non-matriculated students do not have to apply for admission to Western. Instead, they can register for classes beginning the first day of the quarter. Non-matriculated students receive full university credit.

Do not use this application if:

1. You have never been a matriculated Western student. If you have only taken Western classes through the Non-matriculated Student Registration Program or Summer Session, you have not matriculated and must complete the standard application for admission available at admissions.wvu.edu/apply or by contacting the Admissions Office at (360) 650-3440 or admissions@wvu.edu.
2. You have been academically dismissed. Contact Academic Advising at (360) 650-3850.
3. You are applying as a post-baccalaureate student and have not taken courses as a matriculated student at Western since earning a bachelor's degree. Instead, you should complete the transfer/post-baccalaureate application for admission.
4. You plan to enroll as a non-matriculated (not formally admitted) student through Western's Non-matriculated Student Registration Program. Contact the Registrar's Office at (360) 650-3432 or Registrars.Office@wvu.edu.
5. You only plan to register for Summer Session. Contact Summer Session at (360) 650-3308 or Summer.Session@wvu.edu.
