Western Washington University is a dynamic, innovative public university ranked among the best in the Pacific Northwest. ADMISSION CRITERIA

Admission to Western Washington University is selective, as the number of qualified applicants exceeds the number of available enrollment spaces.

Transfer: Western welcomes transfer students in all majors and from all types of colleges and universities. A transfer student is someone who has attempted college credit after graduating from high school or earning a certificate or diploma of high school equivalent (such as the GED). Academic achievement is the most significant factor in the application review. Clearly defined academic goals, completion of major prerequisites and related experiences, number of transfer credits, contributions to and/or experiences with multiculturalism, special talent, personal circumstances, and space availability are also considered. Transfer applicants with fewer than 40 transferable quater credits (27 semester) at the time of application must meet first-year admission requirements, by also submitting a final high school transcript.

Post-baccalaureate: Proposed program of study, preparation for major, cumulative academic record, related experience, space availability and clarity of academic and career goals are the most important factors considered in the application review. All post-baccalaureate applicants are encouraged to contact their intended academic department before applying for admissions and must include a detailed Statement of Purpose with their application for admission. Students planning to pursue teacher certification must apply simultaneously to Woodring College of Education or indicate when they plan to do so in their Statement of Purpose.

First-Year: High school students, including those earning college credit through Running Start or other College in the High School programs, should use the first-year application.

Official Transcripts

Applicants must submit official transcripts from every institution attended. To be official, all transcripts must be sent directly from your college (and high school, if required) to Western's Office of Admissions, electronically or in an official sealed envelope. Only transcripts issued within the last year will be accepted.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

Financial Aid: Applying for financial aid does not affect your application for admission or consideration for scholarships. Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at **fafsa.gov**. Western's school code is 003802. If you are a non-citizen eligible for resident tuition under HB 1079, please submit the WASFA instead at **readysetgrad.wa.gov/wasfa**. Fall quarter applicants should submit the FAFSA/WASFA prior to January 31 for priority consideration. Scholarships: The Office of Admissions awards scholarships to exceptional new first-year and transfer students. Scholarship selection is generally determined by the information provided with the application for admission. Living on Campus

New transfer and post-baccalaureate students may choose to live on campus. The date you apply to Western serves as your housing priority date, and detailed housing information can be found online at **housing.wwu.edu**.

Residency

To qualify as a Washington State resident and in-state tuition, you must be a U.S. citizen or have permanent resident (resident alien) status. You must also be a dependent student whose parent or guardian has been a legal resident for at least 12 months prior to enrollment, or an independent student who has established a permanent home in the state of Washington for at least 12 months prior to enrollment. Verification may be requested. The spouse or dependent of a person who is on active military duty can be allowed to pay resident tuition after providing appropriate documentation to the Registrar's Office.

You are not a resident of Washington State if you (or your parent, in the case of a dependent) have attended, as a resident, college in another state within a year prior to enrollment; have received financial assistance from another state, including a reciprocity award, within a year prior to enrollment; or possess a current out-of-state driver's license, vehicle registration or other document which gives evidence of being domiciled in another state.

If you are not a U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the U.S. and not on a current visa, but have continuously resided in Washington State for three (3) years prior to receiving a high school diploma from a Washington State high school, you may be eligible to pay resident tuition, in accordance with House Bill 1079.

10. Essay Questions

We believe that ability, potential and success are not measured exclusively by grades. Western values the diverse experiences and perspectives that make you unique. Your essay response will help the Admissions Committee learn what is important to you and what qualities you would bring to Western's community. A response to Question #1 is required for most students; you may respond to more than one question if desired. We recommend 300-500 words per question (this is not a firm limit but a recommended range).

Optional for Students with College Level GPA 3.0 or Higher; Required for All Other Applicants:

1. Tell us about your educational and/or professional goals. What are you interested in studying and why? Describe any steps you've taken to prepare for your intended major, related life experiences, enrichment activities, future plans, etc. In addition, feel free to address what makes Western Washington University a good match for your interests.

Optional for All Applicants:
